If you find yourself lost in the deep, deep jungle or in a stormy desert, how would you find your way back? What if it was a mountain, with howling blizzards, where you could not see a thing? Missionaries often find themselves in these situations, but with the help of God they find the right path again. This is how it is written in the Bible.

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take. Don't be impressed with your own wisdom. Instead, fear the Lord and turn away from evil."(NLT, Proverbs 3:5-7)

How much do you depend on God when you run into problems?

David was a missionary studying the Kham language with the help of a Sherpa (a guide and helper when climbing high mountains). But he ended up lost in the high Himalayan Mountains. The cloudy mountains were covered with snow, and David did not know which way to go.

All of the sudden, David could see footsteps in front of him.

"Once when the tracks began a steep ascent, we foolishly ignored them and followed our own instincts, only to be trapped at the lower end by a straight drop-off. We returned to the tracks and followed them across a narrow ledge on a high, vertical precipice. We couldn't see the bottom because of the fog, but whether it was a hundred feet down or a thousand feet down made little difference. If we slipped, we would plunge to our death. There was only one route through the maze, everything else was a dead end. The tracks led the only way."(pg. 32-33, At the Foot of

To their amazement, as soon as they passed the mountaintop, they were on the road leading to the valley. They arrived at the Sisinevillage in no time.

The villagers did not believe that the two had crossed over from the west mountain top. No one had ever crossed that path to the village during this time of year. David then realized that those footsteps were not those of a human. They were the "angel tracks" of God. God had showed them the way.

"To many people, Bible translation and its related ministries are the paths that lead them to the Lord and help them follow God's Word from then on. Limbi was a palm-wine drunkard and troublemaker in his village in northern Congo. But after he was drawn to a skit that depicted illiterate (someone who cannot read or write) people, he began to attend the literacy class held in his village. He was successful at Class One and stepped up to Class Two. Then, he came to know Jesus, the Wisdom, through reading the Bible translated in his own Ngbaka language and became a Christian."
